10. Need of delegation of Administrative discretion.
11. The different grounds based on which the administrative action can be challenged.
12. The invoking of writ jurisdiction of Supreme Court and Various High Courts against the administrative actions and inactions.
13. The establishment of Lok Pal/ Lok Ayukta, CVC and implementation Right to Information Act.

1. To implement the concept of Rule of Law and Doctrine of Separation of Powers.
2. To identify the different administration factions and subject them to judicial review, thereby restraining them from abusing their powers.
3. Will be able to justify the delegation of various types of powers to administration in a welfare state.
4. Will be in a position to defend the rights of the people not only before the Supreme Court and different High Courts of the country but also before various Tribunals constituted under different Acts.
5. Will be in a position to bound down the administration to the principles of Natural Justice.
6. Will restraint the administration action from abusing the powers delegated to them by invoking the writ jurisdiction of Courts,
7. Will be well versed with the working of Lok Pal, Lok Ayoukta and Central Vigilance Commission.
8. Will make the administration accountable by invoking the Right to Information Act.
