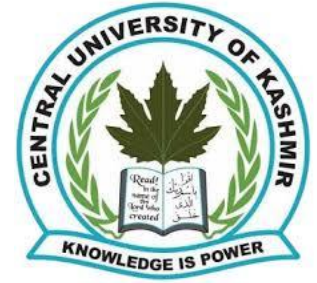

About the Central University of Kashmir (CUK)

The abstracts in original shall be in minimum of 200 words and maximum of 250. The abstract must describe the theme and research problem of the paper, name of the author/s, institutional affiliation and contact details.

The papers in soft copy shall be submitted to nationalseminarslscuk@gmail.com with the subject "National Seminar Submission" by or before **20th August, 2021**. The paper submitted must follow the following formatting guidelines:

- The papers shall be submitted in MS Word format only.
- The body text should be Times New Roman with font size of 12 and line spacing of 1.5.
- The footnotes should be Times New Roman with font size of 10 and line spacing of 1.0.
- The ILI, New Delhi footnote pattern shall be followed.

- The maximum length of the paper must not be more than 4000 words.

Registration Fee

There will be no registration fee for participation or presentation of the paper.

Note: Absentia presentations in no case shall be entertained.

Publications

All the selected papers presented shall be published in Edited Book published by National Publisher after proper plagiarism check by the School of Legal Studies and proper recommendation of the referee and declaration signed by the author/s of the paper.
