Dr. Razwana Begum - *Gandhian Philosophy of Justice, Restoration and Healing*

Razwana Begum will moderate the session. She is Head of the Public Safety and Security Programme at Singapore University of Social Sciences. She holds a PhD in business ethics and restorative justice from Monash University, Australia, & post-graduate qualifications in social work, criminology, and counselling. Razwana also has spent 18 years with the Ministry of Social and Family Development, where she worked directly with children and individuals in contact with the Criminal Justice & Child Protection systems.



Alasdair Roy (OAM) - *Begin with the Children: Gandhi and Children's Rights*

Alasdair Roy is an Australian based Consultant Psychologist with over 25 years' experience working with children and young people. Alasdair's areas of expertise include children and young people in the Child Protection, Youth Justice, and Mental Health systems. Alasdair is also an Associate Faculty at the Singapore University of Social Sciences, where he teaches Counselling Psychology. In 2016, Alasdair was awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia for services to children and young people.



Kata Fodor - *On Gandhi's Relevance for Contemporary Peacebuilding*

Kata Fodor is an Associate Faculty at the Singapore University of Social Sciences, where she is currently developing a course on Peacebuilding & Security. She has studied biology, environmental policy, and peacebuilding, and has held research, teaching, advisory, policy and human rights advocacy positions in Hungary, Laos, & the United States. Her work spans diverse thematic issues, including environmental justice, restorative justice, and processes of public dialogue and engagement.



Beverly Roach - *Right to Public Safety: Gandhi Philosophy of Non-violent Civil Expression*

Beverly Roach served in the Canadian Army for 21 years followed by a career in high-risk security. During 14 years of living in diverse conflict zones from Kabul to Darfur, her primary focus was to enable organisations to operate safely so that they could continue program delivery. Bev has taught and developed a number of security programs. She currently teaches Security Management for the Built Environment and is developing Urban Resilience and Security for Singapore University of Social Sciences.
